











Year 5 Curriculum Information Autumn Term 2016

Please find information below which details what your child will be learning in school this term. We hope you will find it helpful in supporting your child at home. If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's teacher.

Subject	Children will learn
English (Reading, Writing, Grammar, Punctuation, Vocabulary, Spelling and Speaking and Listening) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To perform poetry and plays, including an adaptation of Oliver Twist. To learn and use new and challenging grammatical structures and vocabulary through reading inspiring and thought-provoking texts; e.g. Street Child by Berlie Doherty. To know about the features of and to write explanative reports based upon local historical knowledge of the Anglo-Saxons and the miracles of Erkenwald.
Mathematics 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To extend their knowledge of place value through 5 digit numbers and decimal places To solve calculation questions across the four operations. To tell the time on both a 12 hour and 24 hour clock. To multiply and divide by 10, 100, 1000. To solve problems using multiplication facts knowledge. To calculate perimeters of shape and compare fractions and their equivalents.
Science 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To learn about the properties of materials. To investigate mixing, separating and changing materials. To develop skills as a scientist.
Computing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To use spreadsheets to organise data. To develop further programming skills.
History 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To explore how people's lives have shaped this nation and how Britain has influenced and been influenced by the wider world through learning about Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Vikings.
Art/Design and Technology 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To design and construct models linked to our history topics. To study the skills associated with drawing and painting to produce a piece of work linked to our history study.
Physical Education 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To develop skills in net, court and wall games. To develop dance ideas around urban streets linked to Oliver Twist.
Music 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To perform, listen to, review and evaluate music across a range of styles including the works of the great composers. To further develop their singing skills and to use their voices to perform.
P.S.H.E 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The skills needed to be an effective learner. To consider the thoughts and feelings associated with new beginnings.
R.E 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To consider the question "What is God?" To learn how different religions express their beliefs about the nature of God.



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Things you can do to help at home:

- Talk to your child about what they have been learning at school.
- Listen to them read regularly.
- Practise multiplication facts for instant recall and addition and subtraction facts.
- Encourage and support them with their weekly homework tasks.
